Sorry I had to cut this out because of time. We use 3 parts of wet, mushed up newspaper (I mean really mushed), 2 parts portland cement and 1 part perlite.

The draped pots is a mix of portland cement with a little perlite for texture mixed with enough water to make a thickish soup. I don't really measure on this one

What is the difference between sharp or not-sharp pea gravel?

Sharp gravel still has squarish corners; not -sharp has been tumbled by nature (glacier, beach washed) and is more smooth and rounded. The rounded gravel tends to shift and slide around more when used as a mulch. I prefer sharp, but rounded is more readily available in our area unless it is limestone.
