# **The Jewels of Winter**

Snowdrops & Winter Gardens of England February 17-25, 2024

**Difficulty Rating:** Easy. Daily walking, but mostly easy. There may be some uneven surfaces or terrain in some gardens.

Winter may seem an unusual time for a garden tour to England, but it is the only time to see one of the country's greatest garden spectacles—the annual flowering of the snowdrops in woodlands, gardens, and estates throughout the countryside.

For gardeners "in the know", snowdrops are one of the most popular bulbs amongst collectors around the world, but the mania started with the collections in England, Scotland, and Ireland. While diminutive on their own, collections begun a century or more ago now have bulbs numbering in the tens, if not hundreds, of thousands and the displays are some of the most impressive in the gardening world. For one week, we'll explore the best public and private collections of snowdrops from the Cotswolds to Yorkshire. For good measure, we'll include some visits to gardens and nurseries with impressive displays of hellebores, witchhazel, crocus, and many other late winter and early spring flowering plants, as well.

**February 17—Saturday—**Depart the U.S. for London Heathrow.

February 18—Sunday—Arrive London Heathrow in the morning. Please plan to arrive on an early flight. Our driver will pick us up at Heathrow, not later than 10:30 a.m. We will head straight for the Cotswolds from London with our first stop at Welford Park. Welford Park may be known to some as the home of the Great British Bake Off but come late winter, you will see one of the finest snowdrop collections in the UK. The dainty droplets of snowdrops thrive amongst the 5-acre beech wood and enchanting riverbanks of the river Lambourn. For our official Welcome Lunch, we're off to Barnsley House. Originally created by revered garden designer Rosemary Verey, the gardens at Barnsley House are a classic example of an English country garden that evolves with the seasons. With knot gardens, statues by Simon Verity, and a working kitchen garden that supplies much of the produce found on the menus at The Potager and the village pub, The Boot, there are four acres of carefully tended grounds to amble through and discover. Finally, we'll head for Cheltenham and the Queens Hotel for a quiet evening of relaxation. Breakfast and Lunch included.

February 19—Monday—Today, we're off through the Cotswolds to discover three of the most spectacular collections of snowdrops in England. First, it's Painswick Rococo Garden, famed for having one of the largest naturalistic plantings of snowdrops in the country. The hidden valley which forms the Rococo Garden is unforgettably carpeted with white for a few weeks at the start of spring. There are fifteen known varieties of snowdrops in the Garden, including the famous Galanthus 'Atkinsii'. This distinctively tall, handsome flower was first discovered in Painswick by estate worker James Atkins in the 1800s. Next, we're off to Cerney House whose gardens, set around a Victorian walled garden, are described by Country Living as "what most people aspire to in their gardens — and few achieve." On a winding path through the woodland, you'll find more than 150 varieties of snowdrops, with tantalizing glimpses of the formal garden below. And finally, we'll head for Colesbourne Park, the grand dame of snowdrop collections and probably the most varied of any garden on display, with over three hundred varieties of this spectacular harbinger of spring on show during the short season. Over 10 acres of private gardens and woodland walks with a mix of snowdrops, hellebores, cyclamen and a wide variety of early flowering shrubs will delight you at every turn. Breakfast included.



February 20—Tuesday—Birmingham, England will be our destination this evening, but we have a day full of beautiful gardens and snowdrops to enjoy along the way. First, we'll visit Batsford Arboretum and Garden Centre. Batsford Arboretum is home to a unique collection of some of the world's most beautiful and rare trees, shrubs and bamboos spread across 60 acres. Enjoy impressive displays of spring flowering bulbs – from swathes of snowdrops, aconites, hellebores, daffodils and narcissi, to (depending on the weather and timing of spring) the earliest magnolias, witch hazels, and more. Ragley Hall is a stately home located south of Alcester, Warwickshire and is the ancestral home of the Marquis of Hertford. Surrounding the hall are landscaped gardens and parkland totaling 450 acres. In the formal gardens bordering the paths, clumps of Galanthus nivalis 'Flore Pleno', the double-flowering snowdrop have been planted intermittently between clumps of "named" hybrids, leading to enormous drifts of naturalized varieties in the woods. Then, it's **Packwood House** to finish out our day, where the centerpieces of its winter garden are the amazing 300+ year-old yew topiaries. https://www.nationaltrust.org.uk/visit/warwickshire/packwood-house/the-story-of-the-yewgarden-at-packwood You'll also have time for a late lunch while visiting at Packwood. Breakfast included.



February 21—Wednesday—West of Birmingham, near Craven Arms, lies Millichope Park. Throughout the spring, earliest delights here include winter aconites and a carpet of snowdrops and woodland anemones, followed by daffodils and the native English bluebell. There is an extensive system of lakes and cascades, which attracts both waterfowl and insect life, creating picturesque reflections of the adjacent water gardens and landscape architecture. Even though we can't bring plants back to the United States, we cannot be in the Birmingham area and not visit Ashwood Nurseries Ltd. Plants are their passion and Ashwood's award-winning hellebores are regarded as 'simply the best' strains ever produced. But the story doesn't end there...their plant breeders and growers have worked the same magic on Hepatica, Cyclamen, Hydrangea, conifers, snowdrops, and more. We'll also enjoy lunch at their tearoom. On our way back to Birmingham and our hotel, we'll make our final stop of the day the Birmingham Botanical Gardens & Glasshouses.

Birmingham Botanical Gardens is the green heart of Birmingham, offering a uniquely bio-diverse natural environment. It is one of the UK's most significant historic Botanic Gardens which has remained remarkably intact since 1829 and their collection now includes more than 7,000 plants ranging from alpines to tropicals and bulbs to bonsai. **Breakfast and Lunch included.** 

**February 22—Thursday**—York is our destination today. A fairly long drive from Birmingham, we'll make the most of our day out with three amazing stops! First, it's **Biddulph Grange** Garden, an amazing Victorian garden created by James Bateman for his collection of plants from around the world. A visit takes you on a global journey from Italy to the pyramids of Egypt, a Victorian vision of China and a re-creation of a Himalayan glen. Its strong architectural elements shine through every season, especially in winter and as the garden begins to wake in early spring. From here, we're off to **Dunham Massey Hall.** Nestled between the vibrant city of Manchester and the beginnings of rural Cheshire, Dunham Massey includes a 300-acre deer park, a historic house and buildings, and all-season gardens. Outdoors, accessible paths pass roaming fallow deer and ancient trees in the parkland, while the Winter and Rose Gardens reveal the sights and scents of the seasons. More than 200,000 snowdrops greet visitors during the month of February. And finally, we'll visit the charming **York Gate Garden**, a magical one-acre garden created by the Spencer family between 1951 and 1994. Frederick and Sybil Spencer, along with their son Robin, laid out and nurtured what is now one of the finest small gardens in the country. The design of 'rooms' interlinked through a succession of vistas and executed with meticulous attention to detail owed much to the Arts and Crafts movement, complemented by Sybil's skills as a plantswoman. Tonight, we check into our York hotel for two nights and we'll have dinner at a local restaurant or pub. Breakfast and Dinner included.

February 23—Friday—Today, we have just one destination, but with two distinctly different gardens—Castle Howard & the Yorkshire Arboretum. Although building work began in 1699, the construction of Castle Howard took over 100 years to complete, spanning the lifetimes of three Earls. Whatever the weather, the Castle Howard landscape brings out the color and drama of the season. With 1,000 acres of parkland to explore, Castle Howard is a haven of peace and tranquility with extensive woodland walks, temples, lakes, and fountains. The monumental landscape offers breathtaking views at every turn. Castle Howard's sister property is The Yorkshire Arboretum situated on 128 acres of the former deer park of the castle. It is run as a joint enterprise between Castle Howard Estates and Royal Botanic Gardens, Kew. Originating in 1959, it comprises more than 6,000 trees, including some that are rare or endangered, as well as bulbs and other ephemerals and meadow plants. \*\*\*If the timing and a friend's schedule permits, we will visit a private garden and snowdrop collection near Castle Howard.

February 24—Saturday—\*\*\*Please note, there has been a change from the original tour announcement. The group will RETURN TO LONDON BY TRAIN from Leeds after visiting Harlow Carr. Flights will be ROUND TRIP INTO AND OUT OF HEATHROW.\*\*\*

Goldsborough Hall will be our first stop today. This 16th-century historic house in North Yorkshire, the former home of Princess Mary, boasts a garden that was designed, in part, by the Princess. There have been snowdrops at Goldsborough Hall for hundreds of years but when the current owners arrived at the Hall in 2005, they were hidden under the fallen trees, nettles & brambles. Having cleared the woodland, they were stunned by the thousands that emerged and they now open the garden in February for everyone to enjoy the display. We will officially end our tour with a visit to the relatively new RHS Garden Harlow Carr. Very much part of the Yorkshire countryside, Harlow Carr is a delight in every season. Created on land originally leased from Harrogate Corporation, the garden was established by members of the then newly formed Northern Horticultural Society (NHS) and opened its gates to visitors in 1950 but didn't merge with the RHS until 2001. The beautiful garden visitors see today has evolved significantly from its early beginnings all those decades ago. \*\*\*Our driver will drop us off at the Leeds train station to return to London. Rooms will be booked near Heathrow for our flights home tomorrow.\*\*\*

**RESERVATIONS & PAYMENTS** To guarantee your reservation, deposits, along with single supplements for individual travelers, must be received either by check, credit card, or electronic payment (PayPal or Venmo). Deposits of \$500-\$1,000.00 per person will be required for all tours and will be specified on individual Booking Forms. 50% of the deposit (\$250.00 - \$500.00 per person) will be non-refundable, but will be transferable to another tour should you be forced to cancel your reservation. The remaining 50% (\$500.00 per person) will be refundable up to 120 days prior to travel, per the cancellation and refund policy below. Any cancellations fewer than 120 days from travel will be subject to the fees laid out in the same policy. Single Supplements must be made along with initial deposits. These will remain fully refundable until 120 days prior to travel. After that time, the cancellation fees outlined below will apply.

**CANCELLATIONS & REFUNDS** Cancellations are subject to the following **per person** fees **based on the <u>total package price</u>** as offered by Troy B. Marden Travel:

Cancel 120 days or more prior to departure—Deposits will be 50% refundable. The remaining 50% will be retained by Troy B. Marden Travel and may be applied to a future tour. If more than the deposit has been paid, the full balance, less 50% of the deposit fee, will be refunded.

Cancel 90-119 days prior to departure—25% Cancellation fee, per person, applies
